AUGUSTA (029102) (**August**) – **PROGRAMS:** On 8/2 Lori Showalter spoke to us about Camp Dragonfly. This is for young people who have lost a loved one in the past year. On 8/16 Lion Jerry Fry spoke to us about his experiences as a Park Ranger in the Shenandoah National Forest. **FUND RAISERS:** We sold Brooms at the IGA in Bridgewater and at other locations that earned \$2020. Nut and candy sales also raised \$748. Additional money was donated for Lion Tom Amato \$35. **SIGHT SERVICES:** We bought 11 pair of eyeglasses costing \$275. Purchased brooms in the amount of \$2,255.34. **OTHER:** Average Monthly Attendance: 96%.

BATH COUNTY (009225) (**August**) – **SIGHT SERVICES:** \$200 was approved for indigent sight services. **OTHER:** Average Monthly Attendance: 67. Each year I need the password that changes, but do not get it for 3 or 4 months from International.

BASYE BRYCE MOUNTAIN (042394) (**August**) **PROGRAMS:** The Basye-Bryce Mountain Lions Club met on August 2nd and 16th. The speakers on the 16th were Jennifer Garrett, Jeremy Raley and Mike Dorman. Ms. Garrett spoke about a Back-to-School Supply collection for the Ashby Lee Elementary and North Fork Middle Schools. Mr. Raley and Mr. Dorman spoke about the Shenandoah Education Foundation. **FUND RAISERS:** No fund raisers were held in August. **COMMUNITY SERVICES:** A Blood Drive sponsored by Basye-Bryce Mountain Lions Club was held on August 16th at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church. Twenty-six units of blood were collected by the Red Cross.

We have been doing this for at least 35 years and now we have to have a fire rated tent to cook pancakes and sausage gravy. The tent will cost more than we make in one year. It is getting much harder to do fundraisers. Our meeting on Sept 13th will be our last meeting outside. (**August**) – Report received, but no data in the file.

BUENA VISTA (009227) (**August**) **FUND RAISERS:** Broom sale at Lexington Autumn Festival grossed \$485; sold 272 LOVF tickets at Rockbridge-Parry McCluer football game.

CHARLOTTESVILLE HOST (009228) (**August**) – **PROGRAMS:** We had a LAMP-Report on Visual Screening and medical treatments by Lion Peter Netland, MD. We also had a report on the 2011 Lions International Convention in Seattle, WA by Lion Don Colley, PCC. Broom Sales netted \$150. **SIGHT SERVICES:** Two-Members worked at LAMP held at Wise, VA. **HEARING SERVICES:** We turned in 14 pair of Hearing Aids for the Lions of VA Hearing Foundation. **COMMUNITY SERVICES:** Two-Lions worked the Soup Kitchen for 22 volunteer Hours. One Lion played for the Elderly Piano-Sing-A-longs and put in 22 volunteer hours. **OTHER:** Average Monthly Attendance: 94.

CHARLOTTESVILLE LIONESS (68812) (**August**) – **PROGRAMS:** PDG Don Shoemaker presented a program on the differences between the Sight Foundation of Va. and the Old

Dominion Eye Bank. **FUND RAISERS:** We sold sodas and water at Fridays After Five, which has earned the club \$110 so far with 4 members participating. Hearing Days collections were \$176.10 with 8 members participating. **SIGHT SERVICES:** 6 members volunteered a total of 27 hrs. for SAHMSU at Westhaven Day on Aug. 6th. Participation was light due to bad weather. **COMMUNITY SERVICES:** Two members volunteered 6 hrs each for the handicapped. Five members volunteered a total of 94 hrs to children's services. Two members volunteered a total of 42 hours to the food bank and 2 more members volunteered 2 hours with shut ins. **OTHER:** Average Monthly Attendance: 95%.

CHARLOTTESVILLE TJ (009229) (**August**) – **FUND RAISERS:** Fridays after Five at the Charlottesville Pavillion when our club worked at two events with 6 members at each event and earned \$165 per event. Our annual nut sale is in process; inventory has been ordered. **COMMUNITY SERVICES:** \$750 to be donated to Stone Robinson Elementary for clothing for the less privileged. **OTHER:** A Zone Meeting was held on Sept 27th and was attended by our President and Secretary

CLARKE COUNTY (009230) (**August**) – **PROGRAMS:** On August 4th, Colt Tallent spoke to the club about Audley Farm, a premier Thoroughbred farm located in Clarke County. On August 18th, our meeting was cancelled because our Lions were staffing the SAHMSU at the County Fair. **SIGHT SERVICES:** What a great time we had at the Clarke County Fair on the 15-20 of August 2011. We had a super new location which gave us lots of room to spread out. Lions Greg and Josh Drivers of the Sight and Hearing Mobile Screening Unit (SAHMSU) found the site to be much more accessible and saved a lot of time and effort in getting set up and packing up to return to Weyers Cave. We had a great power supply, the lot was level, and we were on a well-traveled path from the new track and barns to the rest of the Fair. The Monday night thunder and lightning storm had people running for cover and then slippin' and slidin' in the resulting mud. We only screened 3 people on Monday. But we screened 14 on Tuesday, 28 on Wednesday, 17 on Thursday, 16 on Friday, and 19 on Saturday for a total of 97 screenings. Three children were screened with the Welch Allyn digital screener. Six clients were referred for vision and 10 referred for hearing. We also talked at length with several people who may need assistance in obtaining a Leader Dog and will continue to follow-up with them. Thanks to Lions Greg Hart and Josh Huff who drove to Weyers Cave to pick up the Unit on Sunday before the Fair and returned it on Sunday after the Fair. Thanks to our technicians Lions Bill Johnston, Dick Drake, John Lincoln, and Sharon Hart. And a special ROAR to the screeners and registrars Ivan Armacost, Warren Arthur, Kathleen Ault, Barbara Ault, Keith Brobst, Hack Chappel, George Dellinger, Paul Doyle, Stuard Dunn, Helene Eney, John Gallagher, Craig Gilman, Mary Gott, Matt Hoff, Ron Jones, Doug Kruhm, Jean Landers, John Larrick, Jim Livengood, Mike Malucci, George Maxwell, Ralph Pierce, Bill Propst, Dan Sechrist, and Bev Whiting who talked with potential clients, conducted the screenings, and were the face of Clarke County Lions Club to the community.
